in the atmospheric surroundings of the Pen Museum and discover how Birmingham became the centre of the Pen Making World during the 19th Century, when it produced around 75% of the world's pens.

The museum is in the former pen factory of gold pen makers, W.E. Wiley, where you will see presses and tools like those used by the female workforce, who produced more than 18,000 pen nibs a day. Our volunteers will tell stories of the harsh working lives of the workers and ingenuity of entrepreneurs such as Josiah Mason that helped mass produce pens making them accessible to the masses and help improve literacy skills.



There are lots of family activities, children's trails and demonstrations or try your hand at writing with quills and dip pens, or see displays of exquisite and unusual pens, related objects, from beautiful inkwells to the curious. Our experienced volunteers are on hand to help you make the best of your visit.
